The dark days of December are upon us. Here in the northern hemisphere, our days are the shortest they will be during the year. I find myself wanting to light candles as we eat supper. I remind myself that 6:30 pm is too early to go to bed, even if the sky tells me differently.

Jesus, as the light of the world, is a welcome image in these dark days of Advent. On Sunday mornings, we will gather around this theme. As we light our Advent Candles in worship, we will Wait, Watch, Prepare, and Praise the Light of Jesus! My prayer is that in the midst of this troubled world, our gatherings on Sundays will bear witness to the good news of Jesus. "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." John 1:9 (NIV)

Yet, even as I hold to the truth that Jesus is the Light of the World, I trust that Jesus is also with us in the darkness. In her book "Learning to Walk in the Dark" Barbara Brown Taylor, explores the redeeming qualities of the dark. She writes,

"Darkness is shorthand for anything that scared me — either because I am sure that I do not have the resources to survive it or because I do not want to find out. If I had my way, I would eliminate everything from chronic back pain to the fear of the devil from my life and the lives of those I love. At least I think I would. The problem is this: when, despite all my best efforts, the lights have gone off in my life, plunging me into the kind of darkness that turns my knees to water, I have not died. The monsters have not dragged me out of bed and taken me back into their lair. Instead, I have learned things in the dark that I could never have learned in the light, things that have saved my life over and over again, so that there is really only one logical conclusion. I need darkness as much as I need light."

So, in addition to celebrating that Jesus is the Light of the World, this Advent I'm inviting us to ponder how Jesus meets us in the darkness. Watch for a family advent calendar, daily radio & video devotions, and a Soup & Group Advent Gathering on Wednesdays in December. In these ways, we will explore God's presence in both light & darkness.






